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Drug or Alcohol-Related Cases: Checklist

Before you consult a toxicology expert for your drug or alcohol-related case, what are some facts you want to be sure to have on-hand? And how do you select an appropriate expert?

## **Alcohol-related cases**

- 1. Time of first and last alcoholic beverage
- 2. Type/amount of alcoholic drinks consumed
- 3. Symptoms/behavior at time of incident
- 4. Patient weight
- 5. Empty or full stomach while drinking?
- 6. History of alcohol use: occasional or regular use?
- 7. Time of alcohol testing, place of testing, and method used
- 8. Medical history including all medical conditions and prescription, over-the-counter, and herbal medications

## **Drug-related cases**

- Medical history
- 2. Complete toxicology laboratory record (drug levels with units of measurement, method of measurement, time of collection, and time of testing)
- 3. Symptoms/behavior at time of incident
- 4. Are there any state laws regarding driving under the influence of the drug in question (without the need for proof of impairment)? (example: marijuana)

## Consulting a qualified toxicology expert

- 1. What is the training of the expert? Is it only in medicine or does the expert have specialized training in the field of toxicology?
- 2. What type of toxicology does the expert have experience in? Clinical or medical (patient-centered), reproductive, analytical, forensic?
- 3. Does the expert have board certification in toxicology? Is the certification still valid?
- 4. What academic experience does the expert have in toxicology? Publications? Teaching? Research?
- 5. Does the expert have experience with your particular type of case?

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
